THOUGHTS

The short days, cold and wet weather it's hard to think about seed planting and propagation. But this is the right time to look at seed catalogues or go to Orange County Farm Supply on Chapman(west of Main in Orange) and decide what to do in the coming spring. We have available plots and will soon have identifiers of which ones they are. If you have any friends that will be interested in growing their own organic vegatables have them get a plot, can't beat the price. Community gardens is a great way to improve your contacts in the neighborhood and get to know other gardeners.

COMPOST AND SOIL

Compost is a great addition to your plot any time. Loam, what is loam? It is a great growing medium but usually used in the same sentence as top soil but there is a big difference. Loam has to contain organic matter(clippings, decaying root fibers, worm castings, etc.) Loam should be a ratio of: 40% sand; 40% silt(organic); and 20% clay. Let it lie fallow for a couple of weeks and you have a great seed bed.

Remember to rotate your crops, don't plant the same thing in the same location.

WHAT DO WE GROW NOW?

Roses need prunning and planting. If your not sure what to do, let us know and we'll put on a class on roses. Get your plots ready, add comost, manure etc. good soil is so important. If you don't know what to do, ask us, the Steering Committee will have or get the answer.

WE NEED HELP MOVING THE PILES OF MULCH! DO YOU KNOW ANYONE WHO CAN HELP? IF YOU WANT SOME FOR YOUR HOME OR NEIGHBORS GARDEN, LOAD UP.
